Mountain Creek State High School offers the *Young Scholars Program* as a two-year program which commences in Year 5 and continues through Year 6.

What is the Young Scholars program?

The program is designed to provide enrichment opportunities for bright and motivated students. 'Young Scholars' will participate in a number of challenging activities along with other like-minded students during their final 2 years of primary school.

Successful applicants will participate in a variety of extension activities throughout the year at Mountain Creek SHS. It is envisaged that there will be approximately 8 activities that occur throughout the year, on an afternoon from 1.40pm – 4.00pm. Activities will cover a range of subject areas including Science, Maths, English, Humanities, Information Technology, Creative Industries (Music, Visual Art, Dance, Drama), Engineering Concepts, Business, HPE, Japanese and Spanish. As such, Young Scholars will have access to state-of-the-art facilities not normally available in Primary schools.

Young Scholars do not gain automatic entry to our Zenith Program in Year 7. Completion of a general enrolment application and Zenith Application is required. These forms are available on the school website or from the School Administration office. As students progress into their senior years of schooling they may complete either the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (recognised by universities worldwide) or the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority Program and then gain successful entry into a University of their choice.

The Young Scholars Program is to reward outstanding young students who have succeeded academically, are good role models for their peers, and also are strong in one or more areas of sport, visual art, dance, drama, music, public speaking, debating and information technology. Such 'all-roundedness' in students will provide them with an education for life in the 21st Century. This philosophy is continued in MCSHS's Junior Secondary years and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program and QCAA Program – where students are further encouraged to be critical thinkers with a sense of international-mindedness in an interconnected, globalised world.

5. Successful applicants of the Young Scholars Program will be announced in Term 4. Successful Applicants will be notified in writing as will unsuccessful applicants.
6. Successful applicants of the Young Scholars Program will be required to cover bus costs associated with transporting students to the program. A bus is provided to collect students from Buderim SS, Mooloolaba SS, Buddina SS, and Brightwater SS. (Students from Mountain Creek SS will walk across to Mountain Creek SHS for the program.) Transport arrangements for all students at the conclusion of each days program is the responsibility of parents/guardians.

Applications must be received by Friday 29st July, 2022.
